HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; MSA 16.409 and MCL 400.37; MSA 16.437 upon claimant's January 7, 2011 request for a hearing to protest the department's denial of the claimant's Medical Assistance(MA-P). After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on Thursday, April 7, 2010. The claimant personally appeared and testified on his own behalf with his girlfriend, S.C., as a witness.

ISSUE

Whether claimant meets the disability criteria for MA-P?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds a material fact:

- 1. On August 27, 2010, claimant applied for MA-P.
- 2. Subsequent to the hearing, the Social Security Administration determined that the claimant met the disability criteria for the SSI program with a disability onset date of august 2010.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program which provides financial assistance for disabled persons is established by 2004 PA 344. The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MAC R 400.3151-400.3180. Department policies are found in the Program

Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by the Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Because of the Social Security Administration determination, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to discuss the issue of disability. PEM, Item 260; PEM, Item 261.

The claimant is eligible for MA-P retroactive to August 2010 with a medical review required if the claimant is not in payment status.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law decides that the claimant meets the definition of medically disabled under MA-P retroactive to August 2010 with a medical review required if the claimant is not in payment status.

Accordingly, if is has not already done so, the department is ORDERED to open an ongoing MA case for the claimant effective the month of SSI entitlement.
