#### **HEARING DECISION**

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon the Claimant 's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on March 31, 2011. The Claim ant appeared at the hearing and testified.

#### <u>ISSUE</u>

Was the Department correct in denying Claimant's AMP application?

### FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- (1) Claimant applied for AMP benefits in October 2010.
- (2) Claimant received \$783 in employment income in October 2010.
- (3) Claimant received \$959 in unemployment benefits in November 2010.
- (4) On November 3, 2010, the Departm ent denied Claim ant's AMP application due to excess income
- (5) Claimant requested a hearing on November 26, 2010 contesting the denial of AMP benefits.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

The Adult Medical Program (AMP) is established by Title XXI of the Social Security Act; (1115)(a)(1) of the Social Security Act, and is administered by the Department of Human Services (DHS or department) pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq. Department policies are contained in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

For AMP benefits, BEM 640 dictates that income eligibility is met when the net income does not exceed the AMP income limit. To calculate net income, \$200.00 is taken from gross earnings. In addition, a deduction of 20% is taken from the remaining gross earnings. RFT 236 shows the AMP monthly income limit for an individual and spouse to be \$316.00. A deduction for child support paid is also taken when relev ant. BEM 640, p. 4.

In the present case, Claimant had earne d income of \$783 in October 2010 from employment. Claimant's earned income of \$783 per month yields \$466 per month after the abov e-described deductions. Claimant received \$959 in unemploym ent compensation in October 2010. Claimant's net income was \$1425. The net income limit for AMP is \$316. RF T 236. Therefore Claimant does have excess net income and is ineligible for the Adult M edical Program. This is the determination made by the Department and it is correct.

## **DECISION AND ORDER**

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusion sof law, finds that the Department properly denied the Claimant's AMP application, and it is ORDERED that the Department's decision in this regard be and is hereby AFFIRMED.
