## HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; and MCL 400.37; upon claimant's request for a hearing to protest the denial of claimant's application for Medical Assistance (MA) and State Medical Program (SDA). After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on January 25, 2011.

#### **ISSUE**

Whether claimant meets the disability criteria for MA and SDA?

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On July 18, 2010, claimant applied for MA-P and SDA with the Michigan Department of Human Services (DHS).
- 2. Claimant did not apply for retroactive MA.
- 3. On June 21, 2010, MRT denied.
- 4. On June 22, 2010, the department issued notice.
- 5. On July 21, 2010, claimant filed a hearing request.
- 6. On October 22, 2010, SHRT denied claimant.

- 7. At the conclusion of the hearing, the record was held open at claimant's request for the submission of additional medical records. On February 17, 2011, SHRT reversed itself and approved claimant MA-P but denied claimant retro MA-P.
- 8. As noted in Finding of Fact #2 above, claimant did not apply for retro MA and thus, there are no months left to substantively review.

# CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program which provides financial assistance for disabled persons is established by 2004 PA 344. The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MAC R 400.3151-400.3180. Department policies are found in the Program Administrative Manual (PAM), the Program Eligibility Manual (PEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Because of the SHRT determination, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to discuss the issue of disability, per PAM, Item 600.

The department is required to initiate a determination of claimant's financial eligibility for the requested benefits, if required by DHS policy and procedure.

## DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the claimant meets the definition of medically disabled under the MA and SDA programs as of the July 18, 2010 application date, if otherwise eligible, and as permitted under policy and procedure. It is noted that claimant did not apply for retro MA.

According, the department's denial is hereby REVERSED.

The department is Ordered to reinstate claimant's July 18, 2010 application and issue any supplemental benefits to claimant to which he may be entitled.

The department shall review this case in accordance with its usual policy and procedure.
