HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; MSA 16409 and MCL 40037; M SA 16.437 upon the claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone he aring was held in Det roit, Michigan on May 18, 20 11. The claim ant was represented by her Au thorized Representative (AR), L & S Associates.

ISSUE

Did the Department of Hum an Services (Department) properly deny the claimant's Medical Assistance (MA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On January 28, 2010, the claimant applied for MA and retroactive MA.
- 2. The Department de nied the claimant's MA application bec ause the claimant turned 21 years of age on
- On August 19, 2010, the claimant's AR filed a request for hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is estab lished by Title XIX of the Social Sec urity Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The

Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MC L 400.105. Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Bridges Reference Manual (BRM).

The Department relies on BEM 132 which reads in part:

DEPARTMENT POLICY

This is a FIP-related Group 2 MA category.

MA is available to a person who is under age 21 and meets the eligibility factors in this item. All eligibility factors must be met in the calendar month being tested. (BEM 132, p.1.)

In the instant case the claimant turned 21 on January 12, 2010.

The claimant's AR argues t hat BEM 240 allows the claim ant to receive MA for the month in which she turned 21.

FIP, SDA, RAP, CDC, MA and AMP Only

Age is a n eligibility factor for FIP, SDA, R AP, CDC, AMP, and certain MA types of assistance.

An individual remains eligib le with respect to age for the entire month in which they reach the maximum age.

Bridges evaluates age as an eligibility factor at application, redetermination and whenever an individual reaches an age limit defined in policy below. (BEM 240, p.1.)

This Administrative Law Judge finds that the Department was incorrect in denying the claimant's MA for the month of January. Both BEM 240 and BEM 132 indicate that the "eligibility factors must be met in the month being tested," in this instance January, and that an "i ndividual r emains eligible for the entire month in which they reach the maximum age," again January. The Department argues that this only pertains to an individual that was already receiving benefits but this Administrative Law Judge can find no such reference in the policy.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, REVERSES AND ORDERS the Depart ment to include January, 2010, in the claimant's MA coverage.
