## ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge by authority of MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon Claimant's request for a hearing filed on March 29, 2011. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held June 16, 2011. Claimant personally appeared and provided testimony.

Prior to the closure of the hearing record, Claimant testified that she now understood the department's actions. Claimant requested the hearing regarding the closure of her CDC benefits.
