## **HEARING DECISION**

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; MSA 16.409 and MCL 400.37; M SA 16.437 upon the Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone he aring was conducted from Detroit, Michigan on June 1, 2011. The Claimant personally appeared and testified.

### ISSUE

Did the Department of Human Services (D epartment) properly calculate the Claimant's Medical Assistance (MA) and Food Assistance (FAP)?

### FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On April 20, 2011, the Department updated the Claimant's FAP and MA reducing the Claimant's FAP.
- 2. On May 2, 2011, the Claimant filed a request for a hearing.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Sec urity Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Bridges Reference Manual (BRM).

The Food Assistanc e Program (FAP) (formerly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program) is establis hed by the Food St amp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the FAP program pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and MAC R 400.3001-3015. Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Bridges Reference Manual (BRM).

#### **EX PARTE REVIEW**

## **MA Only**

An ex parte review (see gl ossary) is required before Medicaid c losures when there is an actual or anticipated change, unless the change would result in closure due to ineligibility for all Medicaid. When possible, an exparte review should begin at least 90 calendar days before the anticipated change is expected to result in case closure. The review includes consideration of all MA categories; see BAM 115 and 220. (BAM 210, p. 1.)

The law pr ovides that disposition may be made of a contest ed case by s tipulation or agreed settlement. MCL 24.278(2). In the inst ant case, the parties reached an acc ord. The Department agreed to accept documentat ion of the Claimant's medical expense s and recalculate the Claimant's FAP replacing any lost benefits if appropriate.

## **DECISION AND ORDER**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, finds that the Department and Claimant have come to an agreement and ORDERS the Department to accept doc umentation of the Claimant's m edical expenses and recalculate the Claimant's FAP replacing any lost benefits if appropriate.
