HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 following Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on July 27, 2011. Claimant participated and testified. Other participants were [REDACTED].

ISSUE

Did the Department of Human Services (Department) properly deny Claimant's request for State Emergency Relief (SER) assistance with shelter emergency?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, including the testimony at the hearing, finds as material fact:

1. On May 2, 2011, Claimant applied for SER assistance with shelter emergency.
2. On May 5, 2011, the Department sent notice of the application denial to Claimant.
3. On May 10, 2011, the Department received Claimant's hearing request, protesting the SER denial.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The State Emergency Relief (SER) program is established by 2004 PA 344. The SER program is administered pursuant in the State Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

Based upon the above Findings of Fact, the Administrative Law Judge concludes that the Department properly improperly denied Claimant's SER application for assistance with shelter emergency.
