☑ The Adult Medical Program (A MP) is established by Title XI X of the Soc ial Security Act; (1115)(a)(1) of the Social Security Act, and is administered by the Department pursuant to MCL 400.10, et se q. Department policies are contained in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and the Reference Tables Manual (RFT).
☐ The Family Independence Program (FIP) was established pursuant to the Personal Responsibility and W ork Opportunity Reconc iliation Act of 1996, Public Law 104-193, 42 USC 601, et seq. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the FIP program pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and 1997 AACS R 400.3101-3131. The FIP program replaced the Aid to Dependent Children (ADC) program effective October 1, 1996. Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and the Reference Tables Manual (RFT).
The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program] is establis hed by the Food St amp Act of 1977, as amend ed, and is implemented by the federal r egulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department (formerly known as the Family Independenc e Agency) administers the FAP pr ogram pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and 1997 AACS R 400.3001-3015. D epartment policies are found in the Bridges Ad ministrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Elig ibility Manual (BEM), and the Reference Tables Manual (RFT).
☐ The Medical Ass istance (MA) program is es tablished by the Title XIX of the Soc ial Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independenc e Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and MCL 400.105. Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and the Reference Tables Manual (RFT).
☐ The State Disability Assistance (SDA) progr am which provides financial assistance for disabled persons is established by 2004 PA 344. The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the SD A program pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and 1998-2000 AACS R 400.3151-400.3180. Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and the Reference Tables Manual (RFT).
☐ The Child Development and Care program is established by Titles IVA, IVE and XX of the Social Security Act, the Child Care and Development Block Grant of 1990, and the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996. The program is implemented by Title 45 of the Code of Fede ral Regulations, Parts 98 and 99. The Department provides services to adult and children pursuant to 199 7 AACS 400.14(1) and MAC R 4 00.5001-5015. Department policies are found in the

Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligib ility Manual (BEM), and the Reference Tables Manual (RFT).	
Based upon the above Findings of Fact, the Ad ministrative Law Judge concludes that the Department properly denied closed Claimant's AMP FIP FAP MA SDA CDC application case.	
DECISION AND ORDER	
The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, finds that the Department \boxtimes did \square did not act properly.
