HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; MSA 16.409 and MCL 400.37; M SA 16.437 upon the claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice a telephone hearing was hele of from Detroit, Mi chigan on August 24, 2011. The claimant personally appeared and testified.

<u>ISSUE</u>

Did the Department of Hum an Services (Department) properly deny the claimant's Medical Assistance (MA) and State Disability Assistance (SDA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On August 10, 2010, the claimant filed an application for MA and SDA.
- 2. On August 16, 2010, the Department sent the claimant various forms, some of which were to be completed after a sch eduled examination, which the claimant failed to attend. (Department exhibit 8).
- On March 25, 2011, the Department denied the claimant's MA and SDA.
- On April 13, 2011, the claimant filed a request for a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is estab lished by Title XIX of the Social Sec urity Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the C ode of Federal Regulations (CFR). The

Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MC L 400.105. Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Bridges Reference Manual (BRM).

The State Disability A ssistance (SDA) program which provides financial assistance for disabled persons is established by 2004 PA 344. The Department of Human Service s (formerly known as the Fa mily Independence Agency) administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and MAC R 400.3151-400.3180. Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Bridges Reference Manual (BRM).

The client must obtain require d verification, but you must assist if they need and request help.

If neither the client nor you can obtain verification despite a reasonable effort, use the best available in formation. If **no** evidence is available, use your best judgment. (BAM 130, p. 3).

Here, the Department scheduled a medical/psych iatric exam for the claimant and the claimant failed to attend. At the hearing the claimant testif ied that his regular therapist told him that he did not have to attend said exam.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, AFFIRMS the Department's actions in the instant case.
