	Did the Department properly deny Appellant's request for prior authorization?
<u>FINDI</u>	NGS OF FACT
The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:	
1.	At the time of the hearing, the Appellant is a disabled —year-old Medicaid beneficiary. (Appellant's Exhibit #1)
2.	The Appellant testified that she needs her upper partial to be repaired. (Appellant's Exhibit #1)
3.	The Appellant's dentist (upper denture on . (Department's Exhibit A, pp. 2, 6)
4.	On the control of the request for an upper denture and lower was denied as the Appellant was shown to have received such prosthesis within the last five years. She was further advised of her appeal rights. (Department's Exhibit A, pp. 4, 5)

5. On the Michigan Administrative Hearing System for the Department of Community Health received the instant request for hearing brought by the Appellant. (Appellant's Exhibit #1)

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance Program is established pursuant to Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). It is administered in accordance with state statute, the Social Welfare Act, the Administrative Code, and the State Plan under Title XIX of the Social Security Act Medical Assistance Program.

1.10 PRIOR AUTHORIZATION

Medicaid requires prior authorization (PA) to cover certain services before those services are rendered to the beneficiary. The purpose of PA is to review the medical need for certain services. . . .

Medicaid Provider Manual, (MPM) Practitioner, October 1, 2011,² page 4.

Under the general policy instructions for Medicaid related dental services the MPM sets replacement schedules for denture repair and replacement:

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Complete and partial dentures are benefits for all beneficiaries. All dentures require PA. Providers must assess the beneficiary's general oral health and provide a five-year prognosis for the prosthesis requested. An upper partial denture PA request must also include the prognosis of six sound teeth.

Complete or partial dentures are authorized:

- If there is one or more anterior teeth missing;
- If there are less than eight posterior teeth in occlusion (fixed bridges and dentures are to be considered occluding teeth); or
- Where an existing complete or partial denture <u>cannot</u> <u>be made serviceable through repair, relining, adjustment, or duplicating (rebasing) procedures.</u> If a partial denture can be made serviceable, the dentist should provide the needed restorations to maintain

use of the existing partial, extract teeth, add teeth to an existing partial, and remove hyperplastic tissue....

Reimbursement for a complete or partial denture includes all necessary adjustments, relines, repairs, and duplications within six months of insertion. This includes such services for an immediate upper denture when authorized.

If a complete or partial denture requires an adjustment, reline, repair, or duplication within six months of insertion, but the services were not provided until after six months of insertion, no additional reimbursement is allowed for these services.

Complete or partial dentures are not authorized when:

- A previous prosthesis has been provided within <u>five</u> years, whether or not the existing denture was obtained through Medicaid.
- An adjustment, reline, repair, or duplication will make them serviceable.
- Replacement of a complete or partial denture that has been lost or broken beyond repair is not a benefit within five years, whether or not the existing denture was obtained through Medicaid.

MPM, Dental, §6.6A, October 1, 2011, pp. 17, 18

At the hearing the Department witness, testified that the Appellant's request was denied for failure to meet policy requirements for prosthesis replacement on a 5-year rotation. According to the Department's evidence the Appellant would next be eligible for a replacement denture in the contract of the

The Appellant said that all she wanted was her upper denture to be fixed so she could eat without pain. She said no one ever said that the denture could not be repaired.

The Appellant was instructed by the Department witness to have her dentist resubmit the PA because she is within the 6-month eligibility period for replacement denture.³

³ The was no reference in the PA as to whether the exisiting denture could be repaired. There was no request for a lower denture.

The Appellant indicated her understanding of her options going forward.

On review - I thought the Department's decision to deny the request for an upper denture was reached within policy.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the Department properly denied the Appellant's request for PA of an upper partial denture.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

The Department's decision is AFFIRMED.
