SETTLEMENT ORDER

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 following Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on October 6, 2011, from Detroit, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included the Claimant and her interpreter, Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included Medical Contact Worker

ISSUE

Whether the Department properly:

denied Claimant's application for benefits closed Claimant's case for benefits

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

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- 1. On June 1, 2011, the Department:
 - denied Claimant's application for benefits
 closed Claimant's case for benefits
 reduced Claimant's benefits

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2. On July 6, 2011, the Department sent notice to Claimant (or Claimant's Authorized Hearing Representative) of the:

- 3. The Adult Medical Program was closed to new applications in June 2011 at the time the Claimant applied for Medical Assistance in June 2011.
- 4. On July 10, 2011, Claimant filed a request for hearing concerning the Department's action.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), the Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and the State Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

☐ The Family Independence Program (FIP) was established pursuant to the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, Public Law 104-193, 42 USC 601, *et seq.* The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FIP pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and 1999 AC, Rule 400.3101 through Rule 400.3131. FIP replaced the Aid to Dependent Children (ADC) program effective October 1, 1996.

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence

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Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and 1999 AC, Rule 400.3001 through Rule 400.3015.

☐ The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by the Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105.

The Adult Medical Program (AMP) is established by 42 USC 1315, and is administered by the Department pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq*.

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program, which provides financial assistance for disabled persons, is established by 2004 PA 344. The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and 2000 AACS, Rule 400.3151 through Rule 400.3180.

☐ The Child Development and Care (CDC) program is established by Titles IVA, IVE and XX of the Social Security Act, the Child Care and Development Block Grant of 1990, and the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996. The program is implemented by Title 45 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 98 and 99. The Department provides services to adults and children pursuant to MCL 400.14(1) and 1999 AC, Rule 400.5001 through Rule 400.5015.

The State Emergency Relief (SER) program is established by 2004 PA 344. The SER program is administered pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and by 1999 AC, Rule 400.7001 through Rule 400.7049. Department policies are found in the State Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The law provides that disposition may be made of a contested case by stipulation or agreed settlement. MCL 24.278(2).

FOOD ASSISTANCE

In the present case, Claimant requested a hearing to dispute the Department's action. Soon after commencement of the hearing, the parties testified that they had reached a settlement concerning the disputed action. Consequently, the Department agreed to do the following: reregister the Claimant's FAP application retroactive to the filing date (June 2011) and determine the Claimant's eligibility in accordance with Department policy and to seek the necessary verification to determine the Claimant's earned and uearned income.

<u>AMP</u>

Additionally, The Department's denial of the Claimant's application for Medical Assistance is correct, as the Claimant was only eligible to be considered for AMP and the AMP program was closed for applications in June 2011 when the Claimant applied.

The Department correctly denied the Claimant's June 1, 2011 application for Medical Assistance.

As a result of this settlement regarding the FAP application, Claimant no longer wishes to proceed with the hearing. As such, it is unnecessary for this Administrative Law Judge to render a decision regarding the facts and issue regarding FAP in this case.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge concludes that the Department and Claimant have come to a settlement regarding Claimant's request for a hearing for FAP benefits .

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO DO THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. Reregister the Claimant's FAP application as of the original date of application and determine the Claimant's eligibility for benefits in accordance with Department policy.
- 2. The Department shall initiate verification of income and employment to determine both earned and unearned income.

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law determines that the Department's denial of the Claimant's application for Medical Assistance for the Adult Medical Program is AFFIRMED.

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

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
