HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 following Claim ant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on Nove mber 7, 2011, from Detroit, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant in cluded the claimant 's Authorized Representative (AR) Participants on behalf of Depar tment of Human Services (Department) included N/A.

<u>ISSUE</u>

Did the Department pr operly credit the proper medical expenses to the claimant's deductible Medical Assistance (MA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on t he competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

 On November 29, 2010, the claimant's AR submitted medical bills to the Department to fulfill the claimant's deductible and to be reimbursed for that portion over the deductible for August 2010.

Additionally, the Department has not responded to the claimant's AR's attempts to resolve this matter and did not appear for the telephone hearing despite numerous attempts to gain their participation.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, finds that the Department

\square did act properly when \square did not act properly when it did not respond to attempts by the claimant's AR to have the expenses in question added to the medical expenses for August 2010.
Accordingly, the Department's \square AMP \square FIP \square FAP \boxtimes MA \square SDA \square CDC decision is \square AFFIRMED \boxtimes REVERSED for the reasons stated on the record.
oxtimes THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO DO THE FOLLOWING WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. To respond to the cl aimant's AR as to the acceptance of the medical expenses in question.

NOTICE: Michigan Administrative Hearing Syst em (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a par ty within 30 days of the mailing date of this Dec ision and Order. MAHS will not or der a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's mo tion where the final decis ion cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request. (60 days for FAP cases)

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a ti mely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing <u>MAY</u> be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration **MAY** be granted for any of the following reasons:
 - misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision,
 - typographical errors, mathematical error, or other obvious errors in the hearing decision that effect the substantial rights of the claimant:
 - the failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision.
