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| Additionally, the facts of this case are that Claimant's gross unearned income was \$1,020 at the time the calculations were performed. Claimant received a standard \$20 deduction for unearned income receipients. Claimant's protected income limit is \$408, and after subtracting the \$408 from the \$1,000 net income, the remaining \$592 is required by Department policy to be paid as the PPA. |

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing <u>MAY</u> be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome
 of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration <u>MAY</u> be granted for any of the following reasons:
 - misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision,
 - typographical errors, mathematical error, or other obvious errors in the hearing decision that effect the substantial rights of the claimant:
 - the failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision.
