The program is implemented by Title 45 of the Code of Fede ral Regulations, Parts 98 and 99. The Depart ment provides servic es to adults and children pursuant to MCL 400.14(1) and 1999 AC, Rule 400.5001 through Rule 400.5015.

Additionally, A timely hearing request is a request received anywhere in the department within eleven days of the effecti ve date of an negative action. When the 11th calendar day is a Saturday, Sunday, ho liday, or other non- workday, the request is timely if received by the following workday. While wa iting for the hearing decis ion, recipients must continue to receive the assistance authorized prior to the notice of negative action when the request was filed timely. Upon receip t of a timely hearing request, reinstate program benefits to the former level for a hearing request filed because of an negative action. Here, the Department closed the claimant's SDA on September 1, 2011, and the claimant filed a request for a hearing prior to that date.

MAHS will not or der a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's mo tion where the final decis ion cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request. (60 days for FAP cases)

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a ti mely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing <u>MAY</u> be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration **MAY** be granted for any of the following reasons:
 - misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision,
 - typographical errors, mathematical error, or other obvious errors in the hearing decision that effect the substantial rights of the claimant:
 - the failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision.
