The program is implemented by Title 45 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 98 and 99. The Department provides services to adults and children pursuant to MCL 400.14(1) and 1999 AC, Rule 400.5001 through Rule 400.5015.

Additionally, the Department admitted error in closing the Claimant's FAP case and reinstated the case on August 25 2011. In calculating FAP benefits, the Department used pay stubs for June 2011 in the amount of \$394.12 plus 278.54, which total \$672.66, to determine gross earned income. This sum \$672.66 in accordance with policy is then divided by 2 and multiplied by 2.15 to determine gross income of \$723.10. The Department incorrectly calculated the gross earned income to be \$764, which is incorrect and therefore must recalculate the August FAP benefits as the gross earned income is correct. BEM 505.

In addition, the Department closed the Claimant's case in August in error and did not pay the Claimant FAP benefits for the entire month of August 2011. The Claimant only received benefits for the period August 25, 2011 through August 31, 2011. Since no understandable explanation for why this occurred was available, and because it was not due to the Claimant's actions, as the Agency made the error, the Department should have paid the Claimant for the full month of August.

Based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, the Administrative Law Judge concludes that, due to excess income, the Department $\ \ \ \ \ \ \ \ \ \ \ \ \ $

DECISION AND ORDER
The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, finds that the Department did act properly did not act properly.

☐ THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO DO THE FOLLOWING WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

- 1. The Department shall initiate recalculation of the Claimant's FAP benefits for the month of August, 2011 and shall include the correct gross earned income.
- 2. The Claimant shall be entitled to receive benefits for the entire month of August 2011.

3. The Department shall issue a supplement to the Claimant for any FAP benefits she is otherwise entitled to receive in accordance with Department policy.

NOTICE: Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request. (60 days for FAP cases)

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing <u>MAY</u> be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome
 of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration <u>MAY</u> be granted for any of the following reasons:
 - misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision,
 - typographical errors, mathematical error, or other obvious errors in the hearing decision that effect the substantial rights of the claimant:
 - the failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision.
