# **HEARING DECISION**

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to Michigan Compiled Laws (MCL) 400.9 and 400.37, and Claimant request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on March 7, 2011. Claimant appeared and testified at the hearing. appeared and testified on behalf of the Department of Human Services (DHS).

# ISSUE

Whether DHS processed Claimant's Affidavit Claiming Lost, Destroyed, Not Received, or Stolen State Treasurer's Warrant, Michigan Dept. of Treasury Form 1778, July 12, 2010, in accordance with DHS policies and procedures?

# FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on competent, material, and substantial evidence in the record and on the entire record as a whole, finds as fact:

- 1. On July 12, 2010, Claimant submitted an Affidavit Claiming Lost, Destroyed, Not Received, or Stolen State Treasurer's Warrant, Michigan Dept. of Treasury Form 1778, to DHS, regarding his June 17, 2010 State SSI Payment (SSP) check.
- 2. On November 15, 2010, Claimant requested a hearing with DHS.
- 3. At the hearing on March 7, 2011, DHS offered to reopen and reprocess the Affidavit via the DHS Fiscal Unit in the Local Office and to forward it to the DHS Warrant Control Department.

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4. As a result, Claimant testified he no longer wished to continue the Administrative Hearing.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

MA was established by Title XIX of the U.S. Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the U.S. Code of Federal Regulations. DHS administers MA pursuant to MCL 400.10 *et seq.* and MCL 400.105. DHS policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Reference Tables (RFT). These are available online at <u>www.michigan.gov/dhs-manuals</u>.

Under BAM Item 600, clients have the right to contest any DHS decision affecting eligibility or benefit levels whenever they believe the decision is illegal. DHS provides an Administrative Hearing to review the decision and determine if it is appropriate. DHS policy includes procedures to meet the minimal requirements for a fair hearing. Efforts to clarify and resolve the client's concerns start when DHS receives a hearing request and continue through the day of the hearing.

In this case, the parties stipulated to a settlement agreement whereby DHS will reprocess Claimant's Affidavit through the Fiscal Unit of the DHS Local Office, and forward the Affidavit to the DHS Warrant Control Department for further processing. As a result, Claimant testified that he no longer wished to proceed with the Administrative Hearing.

In conclusion, as the parties have reached an agreement, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to decide the issue presented in this case.

### **DECISION AND ORDER**

Based on the above findings of fact, the conclusions of law, and the stipulated settlement agreement of the parties, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that DHS will reprocess Claimant's Affidavit through the Fiscal Unit of the Local Office, and forward it on to the DHS Warrant Control Department for further processing.
