ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge by authority of MCL 400.9; and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing filed on [REDACTED]. After due notice, a hearing was held [REDACTED].

Prior to the closure of the hearing record, the claimant and her representative, her father, understood the actions the department had taken on the claimant's application and no longer disputed the actions. The claimant had not indicated that she was disabled on the application for MA, thus she was denied by the department as not eligible because she was not aged, blind, disabled, under [REDACTED] pregnant and did not have minor children.

It is noted that the claimant did, subsequently, reapply for MA, specifically indicating disability. The department testified that this application is currently being reviewed by the Medical Review Team (MRT) and a decision would be forthcoming. The claimant was advised that she could submit a new hearing request if she disagreed with the MRT finding.

Therefore, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to decide the matter that was in dispute. Pursuant to MAC R 400.906 and 400.903, claimant's hearing request is HEREBY DISMISSED, because claimant is no longer aggrieved by a department action.
