**HEARING DECISION**

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge by authority of MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37. Claimant's request for a hearing was received on January 27, 2011. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on Tuesday, May 31, 2011.

**ISSUE**

Whether the Department of Human Services (Department) properly determined the Claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) eligibility?

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. The Claimant is an ongoing Food Assistance Program (FAP) recipient.
2. The Claimant receives monthly unemployment compensation in the gross monthly amount of \$868.
3. The Department completed a Food Assistance Program (FAP) budget and determined that he is eligible for a monthly allotment of \$49.
4. The Department received the Claimant's request for a hearing on January 27, 2011, protesting the amount of his Food Assistance Program (FAP) allotment. The request was received 13 days after the Department sent its notice of case action.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) (formerly known as the Food Stamp program, is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or Department), administers the FAP program pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and MAC R 400.3001-3015. Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Reference Table Manual (RFT), and the Bridges Reference Manual (BRM).

All earned and unearned income available to the Claimant is countable. Earned income means income received from another person or organization or from self-employment for duties for duties that were performed for compensation or profit. Unearned income means all income that is not earned, including but not limited to funds received from the Family Independence Program (FIP), State Disability Assistance (SDA), Child Development and Care (CDC), Medicaid (MA), Social Security Benefits (RSDI/SSI), Veterans Administration (VA), Unemployment Compensation Benefits (UCB), Adult Medical Program (AMA), alimony, and child support payments. The amount counted may be more than the client actually receives because the gross amount is used prior to any deductions. BEM 500.

The Department determines a client's eligibility for program benefits based on the client's actual income and/or prospective income. Actual income is income that was already received. Prospective income is income not yet received but expected. Prospective budgeting is the best estimate of the client's future income. BEM 505.

The Claimant is an ongoing Food Assistance Program (FAP) recipient. The Claimant receives monthly unemployment compensation in the gross monthly amount of \$868. The Claimant did not dispute the amount of his unearned income. The Claimant's adjusted gross income of \$727 was determined by subtracting the standard \$141 deduction from his total income. The Claimant's excess shelter deduction of \$225 was determined by subtracting 50% of his adjusted gross income from the \$588 standard heat and utility deduction under the [REDACTED].

The Claimant did not report any dependent care, qualified medical, or monthly shelter expenses. The Claimant testified that he has a monthly mortgage obligation, but did not report this expense because he was not able to afford to pay it.

The Claimant's net income of \$502 was determined by subtracting his excess shelter deduction from his adjusted gross income. A claimant with a group size of one and a net income of \$502 is entitled to a FAP allotment of \$49, which is the amount of FAP benefits granted to the Claimant for this period. RFT 260. I find that the Department has established that it acted in accordance with policy determining Claimant's FAP allotment.

**DECISION AND ORDER**

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the Department acted in accordance with policy in determining the Claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) eligibility.

The Department's Food Assistance Program (FAP) eligibility determination is AFFIRMED. It is SO ORDERED.
