**ORDER OF DISMISSAL**

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge by authority of MCL 400.9; and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing filed on February 16, 2011. After due notice, a hearing was held [REDACTED].

Prior to the closure of the hearing record, the claimant testified that she did not disagree with the department's action and that she now understood the actions that the department had taken. The claimant submitted medical bills from June, 2010 on November 24, 2010. Department policy requires the claimant to submit medical bills to apply toward their deductible within 90 days. The claimant testified that she did not submit the bills in the requisite 90-day time period. However, the department explained that the bills were used as "old bills" toward the client's deductible (in accordance with BEM 545). The claimant testified that she now understood the department's actions.

Therefore, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to decide the matter that was in dispute. Pursuant to MAC R 400.906 and 400.903, claimant's hearing request is HEREBY DISMISSED, because claimant is no longer aggrieved by department actions.
