**ORDER OF DISMISSAL**

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to Michigan Compiled Laws (MCL) 400.9 400.37, and Claimant [REDACTED] request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on April 7, 2011. Claimant appeared and testified. [REDACTED], appeared and testified on behalf of the Department of Human Services (DHS).

At the hearing, the Administrative Law Judge clarified that the single issue at the hearing was to determine if the closure of Claimant's FAP benefits on December 31, 2010, was correct. After hearing this statement of the issue presented, Claimant testified that he no longer wished to pursue the Administrative Hearing.

Therefore, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to decide the matter in dispute. Pursuant to Michigan Administrative Code Rules 400.903 and 400.906, and because the Claimant is no longer aggrieved by the Department's action, i.e., the closure of FAP benefits as of December 31, 2010, Claimant's hearing request is **HEREBY DISMISSED**. The Department need take no further action in this matter.
