ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge by authority of MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon Claimant's request for a hearing filed on March 25, 2011. After due notice, a 3-way telephone hearing was held July 6, 2011. Claimant personally appeared and provided testimony.

Prior to the closure of the hearing record, Claimant testified that she did not want to continue the hearing because she no longer needed a home assistant. Claimant stated that because her request for assistance had been denied, she had been forced to relocate and no longer lived in Isabella County and did not want to continue the hearing.

Therefore, it is not necessary for the Administrative Law Judge to decide the matter that was in dispute. Pursuant to MAC R 400.906 and 400.903, Claimant's hearing request is **HEREBY DISMISSED**, because Claimant is no longer aggrieved by a department action as it pertains to SER benefits. It is **SO ORDERED**.
