ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge by authority of MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon Claimant's request for a hearing filed on July 26, 2011. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on August 24, 2011.

Claimant requested a hearing after the department denied her application for Child & Development Care (CDC) benefits due to excess income. During the hearing, Claimant acknowledged and understood that the department's calculation of her earned income was correct which made her ineligible for CDC benefits. Prior to the closure of the hearing record, Claimant testified that she now understood the department's actions. Claimant indicates that her income may have changed and she intends to reapply for CDC benefits. At this time, Claimant was satisfied with the department's actions and did not want to continue with the hearing.

Because the parties have mutually reached an agreement to resolve this matter, there is no longer a pending dispute for the Administrative Law Judge to decide. Pursuant to Mich Admin Code R 400.906 and R 400.903, Claimant's hearing request is HEREBY DISMISSED as Claimant is no longer aggrieved by the department's actions as it pertains to her CDC benefits.

NOTICE: Administrative Hearings may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. Administrative Hearings will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 60 days of the filing of the original request.

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.
