HEARING DECISION FOR INTENTIONAL PROGRAM VIOLATION

This matter is before the undersigned Administ rative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon the Departm ent of Human Servic es' (Department) request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on Dec ember 7, 2011, from Detroit, Michigan. The Department was represented by of the Office of Inspector General (OIG).

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on t he competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

 The Department's OIG filed a hearing re quest on September 26, 2011 to establis h an OI of benefits received by Respondent as a result of Respondent having allegedly committed an IPV.
2. The OIG $oxtimes$ has $oxtimes$ has not requested that Resp $$ ondent be dis qualified fr om receiving program benefits.
3. Respondent was a recipient of ☐ FIP ☐ FAP ☐ SDA ☐ CDC benefits during the period of the alleged OI.
4. Respondent ⊠ was ☐ was not aware of the res ponsibility to report to the Department all changes in household income that could affect benefit eligibility.
Respondent had no apparent physical or m ental impairment that would limit the understanding or ability to fulfill this requirement.
6. The Department's OIG indicates that the time period they are considering the fraud period is February 1, 2006 through August 31, 2006.
7. During the alleged fr aud period, Respondent was issued \$3,542 in ☐ FIP ☒ FAP ☐ SDA ☐ CDC benefits from the State of Michigan.
3. Respondent was en titled to \$791 in ☐ FIP ☒ FAP ☐ SDA ☐ CDC during this time period.
9. Respondent ⊠ did ☐ did not receive an OI in the amount of \$2,751 under the ☐ FIP ⊠ FAP ☐ SDA ☐ CDC program.
10. The Department \square has \boxtimes has not established that Respondent committed an IPV.
11. This was Respondent's ⊠ first ☐ second ☐ third IPV.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Bri dges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and the Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

☐ The Family Independence Program (FIP) was established purs uant to the Personal Responsibility and W ork Opportunity Reconc iliation Act of 1996, Public Law 104-193, 42 USC 601, et seq. The Department (formerly k nown as the Family Independence Agency) administers FIP pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and 1999 AC, Rule 400.3101 through Rule 400.3131. FIP replaced the Aid to Dependent Children (ADC) program effective October 1, 1996.
∑ The Food Assistanc e Program (FAP) [form erly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program] is establis hed by the Food St amp Act of 1977, as amend ed, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and 1999 AC, Rule 400.3001 through Rule 400.3015.
☐ The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program, which provides financial assistance for disabled persons, is established by 2004 PA 344. The D epartment of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and 20 00 AACS, Rule 400.3151 through Rule 400.3180.
The Child Development and Care (CDC) program is established by Titles IVA, IVE and XX of the Soc ial Security Act, the Child Care and Development Block Grant of 1990, and the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996. The program is implemented by Title 45 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 98 and 99. The Department provides services to adults and children pursuant to MCL 400.14(1) and 1999 AC, Rule 400.5001 through Rule 400.5015.
400.14(1) and 1999 AC, Rule 400.5001 through Rule 400.5015.

When a client group receives more benefits than they are entitled to receive, the Department must attempt to recoup the OI. BAM 700.

Suspected IPV means an OI exists for which all three of the following conditions exist:

- The client intentionally failed t o report information or intentionally gave incomplete or inaccurate information needed to make a correct benefit determination, and
- The client was clearly and co rrectly instructed regarding his or her reporting responsibilities, and
- The client has no apparent physical or mental impairment that limits his or her understanding or ability to fulfill their reporting responsibilities.

IPV is sus pected when there is clear and convinc ing evidence that the client has intentionally withheld or misr epresented information for the purpose of establishing,

maintaining, increasing or preventing reduction of program benefits or eligibility. BAM 720.

The Department's OIG requests IPV hearings for cases when:

- benefit overissuanc es are not forwarded to the prosecutor,
- prosecution of welfare fraud is declined by the prosecutor for a reason other than lack of evidence, and
- the total overissuance amount is \$1000 or more, or
- the total overissuance amount is less than \$1000, and
 - the group has a previ ous intentional program violation, or
 - the alleged IPV involves FAP trafficking, or
 - the alleged fraud involves c oncurrent receipt of assistance.
 - the alleged fraud is committed by a state/government employee.

A court or hearing decision that finds a client committed an IP V disqualifies that client from receiving program benefits. A disqualified recipient remains a member of an active group as long as he lives with them. Other eligible group members may continue to receive benefits. BAM 720.

Clients who commit an IPV are disqualified for a standard disqualification period except when a court orders a different period. Clients are disqualified for periods of one year for the first IPV, two years for the second IPV, lifet ime disqualification for the third IPV, and ten years for a concurrent receipt of benefits. BAM 720.

Additionally, the Department sought recoupm ent of an OI and disqualification for IPV based on the Respondent's failure to report earned income. Specifically, the OIG agent presented credible testimony that the Respondent began employment on November 29, 2005. See Ex. 1 pg. 14. The OIG agent then presented evidence that the Respondent began work for a new employ er on June 5, 2006. See Ex. 1 pg. 16. Despite the late reporting, there were no Assistance Applic ations or Change Reports submitted during the period of alleged OI. Therefore, the Department failed to present clear and convincing evidence that the Respondent had the requisite intent to commit an IPV.

The OIG agent presented credible evidence and testimony that the during the period of alleged OI, the Respondent received \$3,542 in FAP benefits. The OIG agent further testified that the Respondent was lawfully entitled to receive \$791 in FAP benefits. To that end, the Respondent received an OI in FAP benefits in the amount of \$2,751, which the Department is entitled to recoup.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, concludes that:
1. Respondent ☐ did ☑ did not commit an IPV.
2. Respondent ⊠ did ☐ did not receive an OI of prog ram benefits in the amount of \$2,751 from the following program(s) ☐ FIP ☒ FAP ☐ SDA ☐ CDC.
☐ The Department is ORDERED to delete the OI and cease any recoupment action.

☑ The Department is ORDERED to initiate recoupment procedures for the amount of

\$2,751 in accordance with Department policy.

The Department is ORDERED to reduce the OI to for the period , in

accordance with Department policy.
