**HEARING DECISION**


This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 following Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, an in-person hearing was held on March 1, 2012, from Pontiac, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included [REDACTED]. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included [REDACTED]. Claimant's Representative consented to the entry of this order regarding a September 23, 2011, application including retro to July 2011 denied by the Medical Review Team (MRT) on November 4, 2011.

Based upon the record before this Administrative Law Judge, and without any additional evidence or testimony of Claimant to supplement the record, and with the consent of the parties, the determination by the Department that Claimant is not "disabled" for purposes of Medicaid is hereby affirmed.

**DECISION AND ORDER**

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the consent of the parties, affirms the Department's determination that Claimant is not disabled for purposes of eligibility for the Medicaid program.

Accordingly, the Department's decision is hereby UPHELD.

**NOTICE:** Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request. (60 days for FAP cases)

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing **MAY** be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration **MAY** be granted for any of the following reasons:
  - misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision,
  - typographical errors, mathematical error, or other obvious errors in the hearing decision that effect the substantial rights of the claimant:
  - the failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision.
