Additionally, Claimant voluntarily dismissed her request for hearing regarding MA and FIP and elected to proceed with the hearing regarding FAP only. Here, the Department (per FEE agents) was unable to locate Claimant at her home. Claimant also failed to provide timely verifications. As a result, the Department closed Claimant's FAP.

Based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, the Administrative Law Judge concludes that the Department
