For FAP purposes, all earned and unearned income available to Claimant is countable. Earned income means income received from another person or organization or from self-employment for duties that were performed for compensation or profit. BEM 500. Unearned income means all income that is not earned, including but not limited to funds received from the Family Independence Program (FIP), State Disability Assistance (SDA), Child Development and Care (CDC), Medicaid (MA), Social Security Benefits (RSDI/SSI), Veterans Administration (VA), Unemployment Compensation Benefits (UCB), Adult Medical Program (AMP), alimony, and child support payments. The amount counted may be more than the client actually receives because the gross amount is used prior to any deductions. BEM 500.

The department determines a client's eligibility for program benefits based on the client's actual income and/or prospective income. Actual income is income that was already received. Prospective income is income not yet received but expected. Prospective budgeting is the best estimate of the client's future income. BEM 505.

All income is converted to a standard monthly amount. If the client is paid weekly, the department multiplies the average weekly amount by 4.3. If the client is paid every other week, the department multiplies the average bi-weekly amount by 2.15. BEM 505.

Claimant contends that the Department miscalculated her earned income because the paystubs she provided from December 2, 2011 represented an abnormally high increase in her work hours. During this period of time, Claimant had paid holidays and had some overtime hours. Claimant did not provide any other paystubs at the time. There was no dispute about Claimant's unearned income from unemployment and child support properly calculated Claimant's net earned income as provided during that period (November 18, 2011 and December 2, 2011) Claimant's earned income plus her unearned income standard deduction = adjusted gross income.
Claimant had a group size of 5 (five) at all relevant times. For FAP, a claimant with a group size of 5 has a maximum net income limit of \$2,181.00. See RFT 250. Because Claimant's net income of \$3,258.00 exceeded the allowable 100% net income limit of \$2,181.00, Claimant is ineligible for FAP benefits due to excess income.
With regard to MA, Claimant lives in Kent County, which is Shelter Area V. RFT 200. For a group size of 5 in Shelter Area V, the MA protected income limit is 240. Because Claimant's net income of exceeded the allowable 100% net income limit of Claimant fails the MA income test.

Based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, the Administrative Law Judge concludes that, due to excess

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the mailing of the Decision and Order or, if a timely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing **MAY** be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration **MAY** be granted for any of the following reasons:
- misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision,
- typographical errors, mathematical error, or other obvious errors in the hearing decision that effect the substantial rights of the claimant;
- the failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision
