Additionally, the department stated that the claimant failed to comply with child support, but did not provide written verification that the claimant did receive the notice from OCS or a worker from OCS to testify about the non-compliance. The claimant testified that she did not receive the notice from OCS because it was an old address. She left a message on the toll-free line, but did not receive a call back by the 2 to 3 week window. The claimant talked to a department supervisor who gave her a direct number to a supervisor. She stated that she did call the supervisor who confirmed that OCS was using an old address. The claimant updated her information with the supervisor.

NOTICE: Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the receipt date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request. (60 days for FAP cases)

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing <u>MAY</u> be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration MAY be granted for any of the following reasons:
- misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision,
- typographical errors, mathematical error, or other obvious errors in the hearing decision that effect the substantial rights of the claimant:
- the failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision.
