HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 following Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on March 1, 2012. from Detroit, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included **Exercise**. Participants on behalf of Department of Human Services (Department) included **Exercise**, ES.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly close the Claimant's Food Assistance (FAP) case due to Claimant's student status?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Claimant applied for benefits for: received benefits for:



Family Independence Program (FIP). Food Assistance Program (FAP).

- Adult Medical Assistance (AMP). State Disability Assistance (SDA).
- Medical Assistance (MA).
- Child Development and Care (CDC).

- On February 1, 2012, the Department denied Claimant's application closed Claimant's case for Food Assistance. reduced Claimant's benefits Based upon redetermination information provided by the Claimant on January 3, 2012 indicating that he was a full time student and was not working. Exhibits 1 and 2.
- On January 11, 2012 the Department sent

- 4. On January 16, 2012, Claimant or Claimant's AHR filed a hearing request, protesting the

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and the Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

The	Adult	Medical	Program	(AMP)	is	established	by	42	USC	1315,	and	is
administered by the Department pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq.												

☐ The Family Independence Program (FIP) was established pursuant to the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, Public Law 104-193, 42 USC 601, *et seq.* The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FIP pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and 1999 AC, Rule 400.3101 through Rule 400.3131. FIP replaced the Aid to Dependent Children (ADC) program effective October 1, 1996.

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and 1999 AC, Rule 400.3001 through Rule 400.3015.

☐ The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by the Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105.

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program, which provides financial assistance for disabled persons, is established by 2004 PA 344. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and 2000 AACS, Rule 400.3151 through Rule 400.3180.

☐ The Child Development and Care (CDC) program is established by Titles IVA, IVE and XX of the Social Security Act, the Child Care and Development Block Grant of 1990, and the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996. The program is implemented by Title 45 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 98 and 99. The Department provides services to adults and children pursuant to MCL 400.14(1) and 1999 AC, Rule 400.5001 through Rule 400.5015.

Additionally, this matter arises out of a closure of the Claimaint's FAP benefits due to the completion of the redetermination questionaire by the Claimant dated January 3, 2012. Exhibit 2. In the redetermination information, the Claimant advised the Department that he was enrolled in college full time. The Claimant confirmed at the hearing that he was not working. Under these circumstances, as explained in the applicable policy, BEM 245, the Claimant is not entitled to receive food assistnace due to his student status.

In October 2011 Department policy changed and redefined Student Status. In order to be eligible for FAP benefits a student is now required to be enrolled in school at least part time and working at least 20 hours a week and paid for their employment. BEM 245, page 3. The addition of the 20 hour work requirement was a change in previous policy that did not include the 20 hour work requirement.

Based upon the foregoing policy change the Department correctly closed the Claimant's FAP case based upon the redetermination information provided.

The closure of the Claimant's FAP case based upon his student status was correct and in accordance with Department policy based upon the evidence presented and the testimony of the parties.

Based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, the Administrative Law Judge concludes that, due to excess income, the Department

denied Claimant's application

reduced Claimant's benefits

DECISION AND ORDER

NOTICE: Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request. (60 days for FAP cases).

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing <u>MAY</u> be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration **MAY** be granted for any of the following reasons:
 - misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision,
 - typographical errors, mathematical error, or other obvious errors in the hearing decision that effect the substantial rights of the claimant:
 - the failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision.
