Additionally, the evidence produced at the hearing did not support the Department's earned income calculation utilized to calculate the Claimant's FAP and AMP benefits, and thus the basis for its action closing the Claimant's Food Assistance and Adult Medical Program was not established. The Department prospected the Claimant's income based on new employment, but did not establish the basis for the income amount of \$3079. Exhibits 1 and 4.

Based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, the Administrative Law Judge concludes that, due to excess income, the Department $\ \square$ properly $\ \boxtimes$ improperly

DECISION AND ORDER
The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, finds that the Department ☐ did act properly ☐ did not act properly.
Accordingly, the Department's \boxtimes AMP \square FIP \boxtimes FAP \square MA \square SDA \square CDC decision is \square AFFIRMED \boxtimes REVERSED for the reasons stated on the record.
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 The Department shall initiate reinstatement of the Claimant's FAP and AMP case retroactive to the date of closure, January 1, 2012. Upon receipt of the pay stubs and employer's verification of last pay received required to be provided by the Claimant, as ordered in paragraph 4 below, the Department shall initiate recalculation of the Claimant's FAP and AMP budgets based upon the Claimant's actual earnings for December 2011 and determine the Claimant's eligibility for those benefits.

4. The Claimant, within 10 days of the receipt of this Decision and Order, shall provide the Department pay stubs for the month of December 2011 from her then employers,

3. The Department shall issue a supplement for any FAP and AMP benefits, if any, the Claimant is otherwise entitled to receive in accordance with Department policy.

5. The Claimant within 10 days of the receipt of this Decision and Order shall provide the Department verification from the employers and of the last date the Claimant received earnings from the employers and verification that Claimant is no longer receiving pay from the employers.

NOTICE: Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request. (60 days for FAP cases).

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing <u>MAY</u> be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration **MAY** be granted for any of the following reasons:
 - misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision.
 - typographical errors, mathematical error, or other obvious errors in the hearing decision that effect the substantial rights of the claimant:
 - the failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision.
