In the present case, Claimant requested a hearing to dispute the Department's action. Soon after commencement of the hearing, the parties testified that they had reached a settlement concerning the disputed action. Consequently, the Department agreed to do the following: reprocess Cla imant's FIP application, effective February 29, 2012. Claimant stated that she was no longer requesting a hearing on MA and FAP.

As a result of this settlement, Claimant no longer wish es to proceed with the hearing. As such, it is unnec essary for this Admi nistrative Law Judge to render a decis ion regarding the facts and issues in this case.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge concludes that the Department and Claimant have come to a settlement regarding Claimant's request for a hearing.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO DO THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. Initiate reprocessing of Claimant's FIP application, with the effective date of March 29, 2012.
- 2. Issue FIP supplements, if any, in accordance with Department policy.
