HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 following Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a hearing was held on July 31, 2012. Claimant appeared and testified.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly close Claimant's Adult Medical Program (AMP) and Food Assistance Program (FAP) cases?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Claimant was an ongoing recipient of Adult Medical Program (AMP) and Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits. Claimant's cases were due for eligibility redetermination by June 30, 2012.
2. On May 15, 2012, Claimant was sent a Redetermination Form (DHS-1010) which was due back on June 5, 2012.
3. On June 5, 2012, Claimant was sent a Notice of Missed Appointment (DHS-254) form.
4. On June 18, 2012, Claimant was sent a Notice of Case Action (DHS-1605) which stated his Adult Medical Program (AMP) and Food Assistance Program (FAP) cases would close on July 1, 2012.
5. On June 22, 2012, Claimant submitted a request for hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and the Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and 1997 AACRS R 400.3001-3015.

The Adult Medical Program (AMP) is established by Title XXI of the Social Security Act; (1115)(a)(1) of the Social Security Act, and is administered by the Department of Human Services (DHS or department) pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.* Department policies are contained in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

A detailed analysis of the evidence presented, applicable Department policies, and reasoning for the decision are contained in the recorded record. During the hearing Claimant was informed of the decision and the reasoning behind the decision.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, finds that the Department properly closed Claimant's Adult Medical Program (AMP) and Food Assistance Program (FAP) cases.

It is ORDERED that the actions of the Department of Human Services, in this matter, are UPHeld.
