The program is implemented by Title 45 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 98 and 99. The Department provides services to adults and children pursuant to MCL 400.14(1) and 1999 AC, Rule 400.5001 through Rule 400.5015.			
Additionally, a thorough review of the Department's calculation of the Claimant's FAP budget was made at the hearing. The Department correctly determined that the Claimant received Social Security benefits in the amount of \$940 and also received \$970.39 in pension income. The Claimant received \$11,644.73 in a lump sum annual pension payment in January 2012, which was correctly annualized by the Department by dividing the payment into 12 montly payments. The Claimant confirmed all gross income amounts for Social Security and pension amounts used to calculate her FAP benefits as correct. Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 506 pp. 6 and 7(2012). The monthly income limit that a FAP group of one person may receive is \$908. The Claimant's net income of \$1442 exceeded the monthly income limit, and thus required that her FAP benefit case be closed. RFT 260, and Exhibit 1.			
Based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, the Administrative Law Judge concludes that the Department

NOTICE: Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request. (60 days for FAP cases)

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing <u>MAY</u> be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome
 of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration **MAY** be granted for any of the following reasons:
 - misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision,
 - typographical errors, mathematical error, or other obvious errors in the hearing decision that effect the substantial rights of the claimant:
 - the failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision.
