## **HEARING DECISION**

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 following Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on September 19, 2012. Claimant appeared and testified.

#### **ISSUE**

Did the Department of Human Services determine the proper amount of Claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits on July 31, 2012?

## FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Claimant was an ongoing recipient of Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.
- On July 13, 2012, Claimant submitted an updated Shelter Verification (DHS-3688). The verification showed that Claimant had relocated and her new rent was less than previously.
- 4. On July 31, 2012, the Department ran a financial eligibility budget to determine Claimant's eligibility. The budget showed that Claimant's current income and expenses required a reduction of her Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits. Claimant was sent notice of the determination.
- 5. On August 7, 2012, Claimant submitted a request for hearing.

# CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and the Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and 1997 AACS R 400.3001-3015.

In this case Claimant does not dispute that her rent expense was going down. The Food Assistance Program (FAP) financial eligibility budget was reviewed and found to be correct. A detailed analysis of the evidence presented, applicable Department policies, and reasoning for the decision are contained in the recorded record. During the hearing Claimant was informed of the decision and the reasoning behind the decision.

# DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, finds that the Department of Human Services determined the proper amount of Claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits on July 31, 2012.

It is ORDERED that the actions of the Department of Human Services, in this matter, are UPHELD.
