HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 following Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a hearing was held on October 3, 2012. Claimant appeared and testified.

<u>ISSUE</u>

Did the Department properly deny Claimant's August 6, 2012 Medical Assistance (MA) application?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Claimant applied for Medical Assistance (MA) benefits. Claimant has but they are not receiving any type of assistance and Claimant did not apply for any assistance for them.
- 2. On August 10, 2012, the Department denied Claimant's Medical Assistance (MA) application because the standard of dependent required for relative care taker Medical Assistance (MA) and the Adult Medical Program (AMP) was closed to enrollment. Claimant was sent a Notice of Case Action (DHS-1605).
- 3. On August 23, 2012, Claimant filed a hearing request.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and the Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by the Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105.

The application and Bridges Eligibility Manual 135 were reviewed during the hearing. Claimant stated she requested a hearing because she did not understand the situation. A detailed analysis of the evidence presented, applicable Department policies, and reasoning for the decision are contained in the recorded record. During the hearing Claimant was informed of the decision and the reasoning behind the decision.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, finds that the Department properly denied Claimant's August 6, 2012 Medical Assistance (MA) application.

It is ORDERED that the actions of the Department of Human Services, in this matter, are UPHELD.
