Dependent child means a person who lives with his parent(s), or other specified relative who acts as his parent, and is: Under age 18, or Age 18 or 19 and a full-time high school student who is expected to
graduate before age 20. (BEM 110, p.6, 8/31/2012).
The claimant is therefore no longer a supervising parent of a minor child and she doe s not qualify for MA in another category.
Based upon the abov e Findings of Fact and Conclus ions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, the Administrative Law Judge concludes that the Department was correct in closing the claimant's MA.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing <u>MAY</u> be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome
 of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration **MAY** be granted for any of the following reasons:
 - misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision,
 - typographical errors, mathematical error, or other obvious errors in the hearing decision that effect the substantial rights of the claimant:
 - the failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision.
