## HEARING DECISION

## ISSUE

Due to excess i ncome, did the Department properly determine $t$ he Claimant's FAP allotment begging June 1, 2012?

## FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judg e, based on the co mpetent, materi al, and substa ntial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On or around January 1, 2012, the Department determined the Claimant was eligible for $\$$ a month in FAP benefits.
2. On July 1, 201 2, the Department determined the Cla imant was eligible for $\$$ a month in FAP benefits.
3. On September 1, 2012, the Department increased the Claimant's FAP allotment to a month.
4. On September 10, 2012, the Claimant requested a hearing because she didn't think the Department was properly determining her monthly FAP allotment.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department poli cies are con tained in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and the Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

The FAP [formerly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and i s im plemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Co de of Fe deral R egulations (CFR). The Department (formerly k nown as the Famil y Independence Agenc y ) administers FAP p ursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and 1999 AC, R 400.3001 through Rule 400.3015.

After an extensive review of the Claimant's budget I have determined all calculation s were properly made at review, and a II FAP issuance/budgeting rul es were properly applied. As such, the Depart ment's deter mination of the Claimant's monthly FAP allotments were correct during the 90 days immediately prior to the Claimant's request for hearing.

## DECISION AND ORDER

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely reque st for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing MAY be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration MAY be granted for any of the following reasons:
- misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision,
- typographical errors, mathematical error, or other obvious errors in the hearing decision that effect the substantial rights of the claimant:
- the failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision.
