**ORDER OF DISMISSAL  
FOR LACK OF JURISDICTION**

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 following Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on January 5, 2012, from Lansing, Michigan. Claimant personally appeared and provided testimony. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included [REDACTED], Family Independence Manager.

In the instant matter, Claimant was 18 (eighteen) years old and received MA benefits under the Other Healthy Kids (OHK) category. On February 10, 2011, Claimant became 19 (nineteen) years old. The Department continued to provide Claimant with MA-OHK benefits through July, 2012. Following a redetermination, the Department, on July 12, 2011, mailed Claimant a Notice of Case Action (DHS-1605), which closed Claimant's MA-OHK benefits and changed her MA to a \$702.00 deductible (MA-Group 2 under 21). On October 17, 2011, the Department received Claimant's request for hearing.

Regulations governing the hearing and appeal process for applicants and recipients of public assistance in Michigan are found in Mich Admin Code, R 400.901 through R 400.951. Rule 400.903 provides in relevant part:

An opportunity for a hearing shall be granted to an applicant who requests a hearing because a claim for assistance is denied or is not acted upon with reasonable promptness, and to any recipient who is aggrieved by a Department action resulting in suspension, reduction, discontinuance, or termination of assistance. [R 400.903(1).]

A request for hearing must be in writing and signed by the claimant, petitioner, or authorized representative. Rule 400.904(1). Moreover, the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM) 600, p. 4, provides in relevant part as follows:

The client or authorized hearing representative has 90 calendar days from the date of the written notice of case action to request a hearing. The request must be received anywhere in DHS within the 90 days. [Emphasis added.]

The record shows that the Department sent Claimant a Notice of Case Action (DHS-1605) advising Claimant of its decision to close Claimant's MA-OHK and change her MA to a deductible. The Department's Notice of Case Action to Claimant was dated July 12, 2011. However, Claimant did not file a request for hearing to contest the Department's action until October 17, 2011. Claimant's hearing request was therefore not timely filed within ninety days of the Notice of Case Action, and is therefore DISMISSED for lack of jurisdiction. BAM 600, p 4.

It is SO ORDERED.
