ORDER OF ADJOURNMENT

This matter is before the Supervising Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 following Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was commenced by Administrative Law Judge Bennane on September 4, 2012, from Detroit, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included the claimant. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included Tom Jones.

The Claimant requested a hearing. However, as the hearing was commenced it became evident that the Claimant is not able to speak, read or understand the English language sufficient to fully participate in the hearing process.

After review of the hearing record, it is determined by the Supervising Administrative Law Judge that the hearing record is insufficient to support Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record. Though the Administrative Law Judge rendered a provisional decision on the record that affirmed the Department's actions in this case, upon further review it is determined that the hearing record is insufficient to support any determination in this matter. Notwithstanding the ALJ's verbal decision, this matter is adjourned for a new hearing with the aid of a Vietnamese interpreter.
