**HEARING DECISION**

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 following Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a hearing was held on August 22, 2012. Claimant and his father appeared and testified.

**ISSUE**

Did the Department properly close Claimant's Medical Assistance (MA) case on June 1, 2012?

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Claimant was an ongoing recipient of group two under 21 Medical Assistance (MA) benefits.
2. On April 26, 2012, Claimant turned 21.
3. On April 20, 2012, Claimant was sent a Notice of Case Action (DHS-1605) which stated his Medical Assistance (MA) would end on June 1, 2012.
4. On May 11, 2012, Claimant filed a hearing request.

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and the Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by the Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105.

In this case Claimant asserts a disability but the evidence shows that the inability to work was not reported to or represented to the Department. Under those circumstances the Department is NOT required to do an Ex Parte review of Claimant's MA eligibility with a continuation of MA coverage pending a disability determination. A detailed analysis of the evidence presented, applicable Department policies, and reasoning for the decision are contained in the recorded record. During the hearing Claimant was informed of the decision and the reasoning behind the decision.

**DECISION AND ORDER**

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, finds that the Department properly closed Claimant's Medical Assistance (MA) case on June 1, 2012.

It is ORDERED that the actions of the Department of Human Services, in this matter, are UPHeld.
