HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 following Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a hearing was held on October 2, 2012. Claimant appeared and testified.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly deny Claimant's May 1, 2012, Food Assistance Program (FAP) application?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On May 1, 2012, Claimant applied for Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.
2. On August 10, 2012, the Department denied Claimant's application. Claimant was sent a Notice of Case Action (DHS-1605).
3. On August 21, 2012, Claimant filed a hearing request.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and the Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and 1997 AACRS R 400.3001-3015.

In this case there was a delay in determining Claimant's eligibility. The Department made separate determinations for each of May, June, and July 2012. Claimant's income and status were checked and verified for all three separate months. The financial eligibility budgets for both May and June were reviewed. Claimant did not dispute any of the factors at the heart of any of the three eligibility determinations. A detailed analysis of the evidence presented, applicable Department policies, and reasoning for the decision are contained in the recorded record. During the hearing Claimant was informed of the decision and the reasoning behind the decision.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, finds that the Department properly denied Claimant's May 1, 2012, Food Assistance Program (FAP) application.

It is ORDERED that the actions of the Department of Human Services, in this matter, are **UPHELD**.
