## **HEARING DECISION**

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 following Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on April 18, 2013, from Detroit, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included Claimant. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included Manager.

# **ISSUE**

Did the Department properly process Claimant's request for State Emergency Relief (SER) assistance with shelter emergency?

# **FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Claimant applied for SER assistance with shelter emergency.
- On August 13, 2012, the Department issued a State Emergency Relief Decision Notice, stating that it would issue funds for rent to prevent eviction upon proof of Claimant's copayment.
- Claimant provided proof of copayment.
- 4. On October 29, 2012, the Department received Claimant's hearing request, protesting the Department's not making its share of the SER payment.
- 5. The Department agreed at the hearing to pay \$155.00 to Claimant's landlord, if it has not already done so.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

The State Emergency Relief (SER) program is established by 2004 PA 344. The SER program is administered pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and by, 1999 AC, Rule 400.7001 through Rule 400.7049. Department policies are found in the State Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

In the present case, on August 13, 2012, the Department issued a State Emergency Relief Decision Notice, stating that it would issue funds for rent to prevent eviction upon proof of Claimant's copayment. Claimant provided proof of copayment. On October 29, 2012, the Department received Claimant's hearing request, protesting the Department's not making its share of the SER payment. The Department agreed at the hearing to pay \$155.00 to Claimant's landlord, if it has not already done so, as the Department representative did not deny that the money was improperly withheld. It is noted that this is not a settlement agreement as Claimant did not appear at the hearing to understand the settlement proposal.

Based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, the Administrative Law Judge concludes that the Department properly denied improperly processed Claimant's SER application for assistance with shelter emergency.
DECISION AND ORDER
The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, finds that the Department did act properly.
Accordingly, the Department's decision is $\square$ AFFIRMED $\boxtimes$ REVERSED for the reasons stated on the record.

**NOTICE**: Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request.

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing <u>MAY</u> be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome
  of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration <u>MAY</u> be granted for any of the following reasons:
  - misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision,
  - typographical errors, mathematical error, or other obvious errors in the hearing decision that effect the substantial rights of the claimant:
  - the failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision.
