#### SETTLEMENT ORDER

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 following Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on January 28, 2013, from Detroit, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included Claimant. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included Exercise (ES, and ES).

# ISSUE

Whether the Department properly:

## **FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On December 1, 2012, the Department:

2.	On November 13, 2012, the Department sent notice to Claimant (or Claimant's Authorized Hearing Representative) of the:

3.	On December 7, 2012, Claimant filed a request for hearing concerning the Department's action with regard to FIP and concerning a reduction in Claimant's FAP assistance.
1.	At the hearing, the parties reached an agreement that Claimant's FIP case would be reinstated as of December 1, 2012. Claimant stated that she was now satisfied with the actions of the Department regarding FAP as her FAP benefits had been restored.
CONCLUSIONS OF LAW	
Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), the Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and the State Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).	
The Family Independence Program (FIP) was established pursuant to the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, Public Law 104-193, 42 USC 601, et seq. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FIP pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and 1999 AC, Rule 400.3101 hrough Rule 400.3131. FIP replaced the Aid to Dependent Children (ADC) program effective October 1, 1996.	
The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and 1999 AC, Rule 400.3011 through Rule 400.3015.	

The law provides that disposition may be made of a contested case by stipulation or agreed settlement. MCL 24.278(2).

In the present case, Claimant requested a hearing to dispute the Department's action. Soon after commencement of the hearing, the parties testified that they had reached a settlement concerning the disputed action. Consequently, the Department agreed to do the following: reinstate Claimant's FIP case, effective December 1, 2012. Claimant stated that she no longer requested a hearing regarding FAP, as her FAP benefits had been restored.

As a result of this settlement, Claimant no longer wishes to proceed with the hearing. As such, it is unnecessary for this Administrative Law Judge to render a decision regarding the facts and issues in this case.

### **DECISION AND ORDER**

The Administrative Law Judge concludes that the Department and Claimant have come to a settlement regarding Claimant's request for a hearing.

#### THE DEPARTMENT SHALL INITIATE WITHIN 10 DAYS THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. Remove the sanction from Claimant's case.
- 2. Initiate reinstatement of Claimant's FIP case, effective December 1, 2012.
- 3. Issue FIP supplements, in accordance with Department policy.
