SETTLEMENT ORDER

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 following Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on May 6, 2013, from Detroit, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included Claimant and the term, hearing representative with Claimant's Authorized Hearing Representative (AHR). Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included Family Independence Manager, and the term, Eligibility Specialist.

ISSUE

Whether the Department properly denied Claimant's application for Medical Assistance (MA).

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On June 26, 2012, Claimant applied for MA with retroactive coverage to March 2012.
- 2. On August 13, 2012, the Department sent Claimant and Claimant's AHR a Notice of Case Action denying the application on the basis that requested verifications had not been provided.
- 3. On November 7, 2012, Claimant's AHR filed a request for hearing concerning the Department's action.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are found in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), the Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and the Department of Human Services State Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by the Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and MCL 400.105.

The law provides that disposition may be made of a contested case by stipulation or agreed settlement. MCL 24.278(2).

In the present case, Claimant requested a hearing to dispute the Department's action. Soon after commencement of the hearing, the parties testified that they had reached a settlement concerning the disputed action. Consequently, the Department agreed to do the following: (1) reregister Claimant's June 26, 2012, MA application, with retroactive coverage to March 2012; (2) begin reprocessing the application in accordance with Department policy, on the condition that Claimant or Claimant's AHR provide verification of asset status in form approved by and acceptable to the Department; (3) provide MA coverage to Claimant that he is eligible to receive from March 2012 ongoing; and (4) notify Claimant and his AHR of its decision in accordance with Department policy.

As a result of this settlement, Claimant no longer wishes to proceed with the hearing. As such, it is unnecessary for this Administrative Law Judge to render a decision regarding the facts and issues in this case.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge concludes that the Department and Claimant have come to a settlement regarding Claimant's request for a hearing.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO DO THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. Reregister Claimant's June 26, 2012, MA application, with retroactive coverage to March 2012;
- 2. Begin reprocessing the application in accordance with Department policy, on the condition that Claimant or Claimant's AHR provide verification of asset status in form approved by and acceptable to the Department;
- 3. Provide MA coverage to Claimant that he is eligible to receive from March 2012 ongoing; and

4. Notify Claimant and his AHR of its decision in accordance with Department policy.
