The law provides that disposition may be made of a contested case by stipulation or agreed settlement. MCL 24.278(2).

In the present case, Claimant requested a hearing to dispute the Department's action. Soon after commencement of the hearing, the parties testified that they had reached a settlement concerning the disputed action. Consequently, the Department agreed to do the following: reinstate Claimant's January 4, 2013 application and provide benefits.

As a result of this settlement, Claimant no longer wishes to proceed with the hearing. As such, it is unnecessary for this Administrative Law Judge to render a decision regarding the facts and issues in this case.

#### **DECISION AND ORDER**

The Administrative Law Judge concludes that the Department and Claimant have come to a settlement regarding Claimant's request for a hearing.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO INITIATE THE FOLLOWING ACTION WITHIN TEN DAYS OF THE MAILING DATE OF THIS ORDER:

- 1. Reinstate Claimant's January 4, 2013 FAP application.
- 2. Correct Claimant's records to indicate that October 30, 2009, is her date of compliance with the Department's Office of Child Support.
- 3. Conduct a review of Claimant's 2013 FAP benefits to ensure that she actually received the benefits reflected in the Bridges Eligibility Summary, Dept. Exh. 1, pp. 6-8.
- 4. Provide retroactive and ongoing FAP benefits to Claimant at the benefit level to which she is entitled based on her January 4, 2013 application date.
- 5. All steps shall be taken in accordance with Department policy and procedure.
