Additionally, the claimant was a recipient of Social Security and a recipient of the MA SSI supplement. On November 20, 2012, the claimant received a notice from DHS stating that there would be a reduction of state SSI supplement as a couple instead of at the individual rate to \$35. The department caseworker could not list the policy that required this case action. Therefore, the department has not met its burden that it followed policy in implementing this case action.

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the mailing of the Decision and Order or, if a timely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing <u>MAY</u> be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome
  of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration MAY be granted for any of the following reasons:
- · misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision,
- typographical errors, mathematical error, or other obvious errors in the hearing decision that effect the substantial rights of the claimant;
- the failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision
