## **HEARING DECISION**

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; and MCL 400.37 upon claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a hearing was held on January 16, 2013. Claimant appeared and testified.

## ISSUE

Did the Department of Human Services properly close Claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) for failure to provide required verifications?

Did the Department of Human Services properly close Claimant's Adult Medical Program (AMP) for failure to provide required verifications?

### FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- (1) Claimant was an ongoing recipient of Adult Medical Program (AMP) and Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.
- (2) On November 19, 2012, Claimant was sent a Verification Checklist (DHS Form 3503) requesting income verification from his participation in a musical group. The verification was due on November 29, 2012.
- (3) On November 27, 2012, Claimant submitted a letter which stated he did play with the group but it was not something he profits from.

- (4) On November 30, 2012, Claimant's DHS case worker contacted the manager of a location he band was scheduled to play at. The case worker was told that the ban was paid cash for each member of the band. Claimant was then sent a Notice of Case Action (DHS-1605) which stated his Adult Medical Program (AMP) and Food Assistance Program (FAP) would close on January 1, 2013 for failure to provide verifications.
- (5) On December 11, 2012, Claimant submitted a request for hearing.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

The Adult Medical Program (AMP) is established by Title XXI of the Social Security Act; (1115)(a)(1) of the Social Security Act, and is administered by the Department of Human Services (DHS or department) pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.* Department policies are contained in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) (formerly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program) is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (DHS or department) administers the FAP program pursuant to MCL 400.10, et seq., and MAC R 400.3001-3015. Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Program Reference Manual (PRM).

Department policy provides the following guidance for case workers. The Department's policies are available on the internet through the Department's website.

## **BAM 130 VERIFICATION AND COLLATERAL CONTACTS**

# DEPARTMENT POLICY

## **All Programs**

Verification means documentation or other evidence to establish the accuracy of the client's verbal or written statements.

Obtain verification when:

- Required by policy. BEM items specify which factors and under what circumstances verification is required.
- Required as a local office option. The requirement must be applied the same for every client. Local requirements may not be imposed for MA, TMA-Plus or AMP.
- Information regarding an eligibility factor is unclear, inconsistent, incomplete or contradictory. The questionable information might

be from the client or a third party.

Verification is usually required at application/redetermination **and** for a reported change affecting eligibility or benefit level.

# Obtaining Verification All Programs

Tell the client what verification is required, how to obtain it, and the due date; see **Timeliness of Verifications** in this item. Use the DHS-3503, Verification Checklist (VCL), or for MA redeterminations, the DHS-1175, MA Determination Notice, to request verification.

The client must obtain required verification, but you must assist if they need and request help.

# Timeliness of Verifications FIP, SDA, CDC, FAP

Allow the client 10 calendar days (**or** other time limit specified in policy) to provide the verification you request.

Verifications are considered to be timely if received by the date they are due. For electronically transmitted verifications (fax, email or Mi Bridges document upload), the date of the transmission is the receipt date. Verifications that are submitted after the close of regular business hours through the drop box or by delivery of a DHS representative are considered to be received the next business day.

Send a negative action notice when:

- The client indicates refusal to provide a verification, or
- The time period given has elapsed and the client has **not** made a reasonable effort to provide it.

At this hearing Claimant presented a letter which states that money paid to the band is put in a fund and used for equipment, to reimburse members for transportation costs, and for member meals or other needs.

Claimant testified that he did not completely understand what the case worker was looking for as verification. The documentation provided at this hearing may be sufficient to meet the Department's verification requirements. However, based on the information the Department had on November 30, 2012, the closure of Claimant's cases was a correct action in accordance with Department policy.

## **DECISION AND ORDER**

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides the Department of Human Services properly closed Claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) and Adult Medical Program (AMP) for failure to provide required verifications.

It is ORDERED that the actions of the Department of Human Services, in this matter, are **UPHELD**.

**NOTICE**: Administrative Hearings may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. Administrative Hearings will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 60 days of the filing of the original request.

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.
