During the hearing, the claimant testified that she mailed the required verification on March 8, 2013. The department caseworker testified that she did not receive the verifications. In addition, the claimant did not receive return mail back of the verification from the Post Office. The claimant failed to double check with the department caseworker to make sure that the verifications had been received so if they had not that she had time to fax or hand-delivier before her case closed. The claimant is entitled to re-apply for benefits. |

MAHS will not or der a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's mo tion where the final decis ion cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request. (60 days for FAP cases)

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a ti mely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing <u>MAY</u> be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration **MAY** be granted for any of the following reasons:
- misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision,
- typographical errors, math ematical error, or other obvious errors in the he aring decision that effect the substantial rights of the claimant:
- the failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision.
