

# FINDINGS OF FACT

Department policies are contained in the Br idges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and the Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

☐ The Family Independence Program (FIP) was established purs uant to the Personal Responsibility and W ork Opportunity Reconc iliation Act of 1996, Public Law 104-193, 42 USC 601, *et seq*. The Department (formerly k nown as the Family Independence Agency) administers FIP pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq*., and 1999 AC, R 400.3101 through Rule 400.3131. FIP replaced the Aid to Dependent Children (ADC) program effective October 1, 1996.

☐ The Food Assistanc e Program (FAP) [for merly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and 1999 AC, R 400.3001 through Rule 400.3015.

The Medical Ass istance (MA) program is es tablished by the Title XIX of the Soc ial Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independ ence Agency) administers the MA pr ogram pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq*., and MC L 400.105.

The Adult Medical Program (A	MP) is es	stablished by 42 USC	; 1315, and is
administered by the Department	pursuant to MCI	_ 400.10, <i>et seq</i> .	

The State Disabilit y Assistance (SDA)	) progr am, which provides financial ass istance
for disabled persons, is established by	2004 PA 344. The D epartment of Human
Services (formerly known as the Family	Independence Agency) administers the SDA
program pursuant to MCL 400.10, et see	q., and 2000 AACS, R 400. 3151 through Rule
400.3180.	

☐ The Child Development and Care (CDC) program is establis hed by Titles IVA, IVE and XX of the Soc ial Security Act, the Ch ild Care and Developm ent Block Grant of 1990, and the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996. The program is implemented by Title 45 of the Code of Fede ral Regulations, Parts 98 and 99. The Depart ment provides servic es to adults and children pursuant to MCL 400.14(1) and 1999 AC, R 400.5001 through Rule 400.5015.

Additionally, this Adm inistrative Law J udge notes that this is not a timely hearing request because the department's action oc curred on March 19, 2012 and the hearing request was submitted on September 19, 2012.

The filing form was received on February 27, 2012 for MA with retroactive benefits t o November 2011. On March 6, 2012, the department caseworker mailed the client and faxed to L&S a Verification Checklist, DH S 3503 and an Assistance Application, DHS 1171 to be completed by March 19, 2012. On March 19, 2012, L&S requested an extension, but the department denied their request because based on policy only 10 days are given to complete an appplication per BAM 115, page 5.

#### APPLICATION PROCESSING

## Failure to Complete the Application Process

#### All Programs

Do **not** deny an incomplete application until 10 calendar days from the **later** of either the initial:

Request in writing to the applicant to complete the application form or supply missing information.

As a result, the department has met its bur den that it followed policy in given the claimant and 10 days to complete the application as is allowed in policy.

**NOTICE**: Michigan Administrative Hearing Syst em (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Dec ision and Order. MAHS will not or der a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's mo tion where the final decis ion cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request. (60 days for FAP cases)

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a ti mely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing <u>MAY</u> be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration <u>MAY</u> be granted for any of the following reasons:
- misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision,
- typographical errors, math ematical error, or other obvious errors in the hearing decision that effect the substantial rights of the claimant:
- the failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision.
