# **HEARING DECISION**

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 following Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on June 26, 2013, from Detroit, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included the Claimant. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included ES, and ES.

#### ISSUE

Due to a failure to comply with the verification requirements, did the Department properly  $\boxtimes$  deny Claimant's application  $\square$  close Claimant's case  $\square$  reduce Claimant's benefits for:

Family Independence Program (FIP)? Food Assistance Program (FAP)?

State Disability Assistance (SDA)? Child Development and Care (CDC)?

Medical Assistance (MA)?

FINDINGS	OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, including testimony of witnesses, finds as material fact:

- 1. Claimant  $\boxtimes$  applied for  $\square$  was receiving:  $\square$  FIP  $\square$  FAP  $\square$  MA  $\square$  SDA  $\boxtimes$  CDC.
- 2. Claimant was required to submit requested verification by November 30, 2012.
- 3. On October 21, 2012, the Department

denied Claimant's application.

closed Claimant's case.

reduced Claimant's benefits.

reduction of Claimant's benefits.

5. On January 9, 2013, Claimant filed a hearing request, protesting the denial of Claimant's application.

closure of Claimant's case.

reduction of Claimant's benefits.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are found in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) and the Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

☑ The Child Development and Care (CDC) program is established by Titles IVA, IVE and XX of the Social Security Act, the Child Care and Development Block Grant of 1990, and the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996. The program is implemented by Title 45 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 98 and 99. The Department provides services to adults and children pursuant to MCL 400.14(1) and 1997 AACS R 400.5001-5015.

Additionally, a verification checklist was sent to the Claimant on November 20, 2012 requesting education verification and copy of class schedule and CDC provider assignment. The Claimant did return some of the information on November 27, 2012. but the Department did not receive the class schedule at any time. As regards the Claimant's first application, the Department attempted to verify the information with the school; however, it was discovered the Claimant was not enrolled. Additionally, the Claimant did not bring any proof that she was enrolled in school at any time to the hearing. The Department brought the Claimant's case file to the hearing and did not find the class schedule or verification of education DHS 4578 form. The file did contain a verification of employment but the October 21, 2012 application had already been denied and the verification of employment was late. The Claimant's application of October 21, 2012 was denied due to failure to provide the verification of education. Based upon the evidence and testimony of the witnesses as well as a review of the documents provided by the Claimant, it is determined that the Claimant did not return the required information regarding her school GED completion. BAM130. Overall, it is determined that the Claimant did not provide sufficient information to the Department to find that the information regarding her education verification was provided.

Based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, the Administrative Law Judge concludes that the Department

closed Claimant's case.

denied Claimant's application.

# **DECISION AND ORDER**

**NOTICE:** Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request. (60 days for FAP cases)

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing <u>MAY</u> be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration **MAY** be granted for any of the following reasons:
  - misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision,
  - typographical errors, mathematical error, or other obvious errors in the hearing decision that affect the substantial rights of the claimant,
  - failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision.
