Additionally, the Claimant and his wife were both receiving a credit individually of for their shelter expenses. Department Exhibit 6 and 7. The shelter expenses were counted as instead of the correct amount of Department Exhibit 36-38. Once the Department error was corrected, the Claimant had a decrease in FAP benefits from to Department Exhibit 61-63.
The Department has met its burden that the Claimant's shelter expenses were counted incorrectly, which led to an increase in FAP benefits, with the resulting correction in shelter expenses resulting in a decrease in FAP benefits from to BAM 105, 110, 115, 130, 220, and 600. BEM 212, 550, and 554.
Based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, the Administrative Law Judge concludes that, due to excess income, the Department \square properly \square improperly

The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely request for rehearing was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the rehearing decision.

Claimant may request a rehearing or reconsideration for the following reasons:

- A rehearing **MAY** be granted if there is newly discovered evidence that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision.
- A reconsideration <u>MAY</u> be granted for any of the following reasons:
 - misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision;
 - typographical errors, mathematical error, or other obvious errors in the hearing decision that effect the substantial rights of the Claimant;
 - the failure of the ALJ to address other relevant issues in the hearing decision.
